<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • respect, courtesy and honesty; • teach in a safe, secure and clean environment; • teach in a purposeful and non-disruptive environment; • respect co-operation and support from parents and colleagues. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • model respectful, courteous and honest behaviour; • ensure that classrooms and school grounds are kept neat and tidy; • ensure that the school environment is kept safe and secure; • establish positive relationships with students, colleagues and parents; • plan and monitor student progress.
Parents have the RIGHT to:	Parents have the RESPONSIBILITY to:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • be informed of course and curriculum material, behaviour management procedures, and decisions affecting their child's health and welfare; • be informed of their child's progress; • access a meaningful and adequate education for their child; • be heard in an appropriate forum on matters related to the rights of their child to an appropriate education e.g. Case conference interviews. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ensure that their child attends school; • ensure that the physical and emotional condition of their child is at an optimum for effective learning; • ensure that their child is provided with appropriate materials to make effective use of the learning environment; • support the school in providing a meaningful and adequate education for their children.
